From the mid 1970s Western popular music (including rock-n-roll) finds its way into the USSR, quite an official way already. Melodia, the only sound house in the country starts releasing albums of

the series 'Melodies and rhythms of foregin variety music', among which there happened to be also hits by western pop and rock stars, from Elvis Prestly to Tom Jones. In the late 1970s Kliff Richard, Elton Jones and Bony M performed on tour in the USSR.[4]

This mid 1980's were the first time in which western acts were allowed to tour in the U.S.S.R. and even in Soviet Russia itself. Western music encouraged and nurtured the new sense of freedom and individuality that was growing at the time. It also served as a means of protest against the failed Soviet regime. [5]
